Eucharistic Miracle of LANCIANO

An inscription in marble from the 17th century describes this Eucharistic miracle which occurred at Lanciano in 750 at the Church of St. Eustachio. A mosaic painter doubted whether the Body of Our Lord was truly present in the consecrated Host. He celebrated Mass and when he said the words of consecration, he saw the host turn into flesh and the wine turn into blood. Everything was visible to those in attendance. The Host is still intact and the blood is divided into five unequal parts which together have the exact same weight as each one disc separately.
