Eucharistic Miracles of LANCIANO
1917-1918

An inscription in marble from the 17th century describes this Eucharistic miracle which occurred at Lancia in 1700 at the Church of St. Eusebio. "A mosaicist pious doubted whether the Body of Our Lord was truly present in the consecrated Host. He addressed Mary and when he said the words of consecration, he saw the host turn into Blood. Everything was visible to those in attendance. The Faith is still intact and the Blood is divided into five unequal parts which together have the exact same weight as each one does separately."

MIRACULOUS COMMUNIONS

St. John Berchman was a young man who lived in the town of Lancia in 1700. He was a mosaicist and he was working on a mosaic in the church of St. Eusebio. One day he was working on a mosaic of the Eucharist and he saw the host turn into blood. This was the beginning of the Lancia miracle.

Manuel González García was born in Seville, Spain in 1877 and ordained a priest in 1901. He was

assigned his first parish mission in the little town of Palomares del Rio. It was there, where Our Lord spoke to him from an abandoned tabernacle, that was a defining moment in his life and clarified the direction for the rest of his priestly ministry.
